Pastoral Care Ministry

For many, the events of the past few years have highlighted and exacerbated the pain of loneliness. In turn, many have come to a deeper desire for, and greater appreciation of, being physically present to another person. Whilst the wonders of modern technology have allowed us to stay connected with our loved ones in different ways, no *virtual* connection can ever substitute for being *physically* present to someone else, especially to a family member or a cherished friend. As social beings, we find fulfilment in the very connections and relationships we form with others.

Here at Our Lady of Mount Carmel Parish, one of our great hopes is for members of our community to foster meaningful and Christ-centred connections with other members of the parish. Because the essence of pastoral care centres on being present to someone in their particular situation, one of the ways we aim to bring about this great desire of ours is to develop our pastoral care ministry. We are looking for people who would like to be part of a team that will reach out to members of the parish (and beyond).

Above all, our aim is to connect with, and provide a listening presence to, people who are feeling particularly isolated and disconnected. As members of the Body of Christ and guided by the Holy Spirit, pastoral care encounters can open up channels of healing, support and empowerment.

For those who are interested, the parish will provide a day of training, consisting of two sessions on Saturday, 19th February. These sessions will be led by Br Adalbert Imperial, a Carmelite friar who has experience in pastoral care and chaplaincy, gained from working in the Pastoral Care Team at St Vincent's Private Hospital.

The first session will cover the fundamentals of pastoral care and will be running from 10 to 11am. A second session, covering the practicalities of providing pastoral care, will be held in the afternoon from 2pm to 3pm. Morning Tea and Lunch will be provided and the sessions will be held in the Parish Hall.

Gospel Reflection by Dianne Bergant CSA

Paul teaches us that, united to Christ through faith and in baptism, we are united in his death and resurrection. With Christ we die to sin; with him we rise to a new life. We cannot wait to see proof of our transformation before we change our actions. The proof is in the lives we live in faith. To deny that we have died and been raised is to deny the resurrection of Christ. Paul insists that they cannot be separated. The challenge is to live in and out of this faith.

Both Jeremiah and Jesus introduce us to such a way of living. It is a way of paradox, a way that moves us beyond the self-centred standards of the world. The poor, the hungry, those who weep, and those who are persecuted are really the ones who are blessed. The victims of our social and economic systems, those who have been ravaged by war or have been made vulnerable by life itself are the ones who, if they place their trust in God, will be blessed in the end. They may appear to be the outcasts of this world, but, if they are filled with faith, they will inherit heaven. The wealth of this world and its pleasures are not the blessings that we might think they are. They can blind us to the real values of life and prevent us from dying to the world and living resurrected lives in Christ.
