Alpha and RCIA programs

This Sunday at the 9:30am Mass in our Lady of Mount Carmel Parish Varroville, we celebrate as a community, and pray for, three catechumens who are about to enter the final stage of their preparation to be baptised and confirmed this coming Easter. The stage is known as the Period of Purification and Enlightenment and coincides with Lent: a time of repentance and spiritual renewal for all Catholics. Raquel, Colin and Bhlane are called catechumens because they are in the apprenticeship phase for the past year. By sharing in the Liturgy of the Word, through prayer, learning and coming to know other Catholic Christians, our catechumens are discovering the love and power of God in their lives and in the church. They will be anointed with the Oil of Catechumens, olive oil blessed during the Chrism Mass in 2021 by the Bishop



Brian Mascord, and the anointing is used before baptism to eliminate weaknesses and obstacles to following Christ and strengthen all that is upright and good in them. There are further blessings during Lent.

On Sunday 6 th March, at the 9:30am Mass there will be a rite of sending Raquel, Colin and Bhlane to the Bishop at Wollongong Cathedral to be enrolled in the Book of the Elect. At this Rite of Election at 2pm that afternoon, their godparents and sponsors will testify to the Bishop what they have witnessed: that their catechumen has faithfully listened to, and responded to the Word of God and begun to walk in His presence, that he/ she has joined with us, their Christian brothers and sisters, in prayer. The Bishop will then sign the Book as a promise that the Church will baptise and fully initiate with the sacraments of Confirmation and first Eucharist, this coming Easter. From the 6th March, our catechumens are called "The Elect" and not catechumens because they have been elected by the Church, represented by the Bishop, because they are judged ready to receive the Sacraments.

Our parish also supports and prays for adult candidates, those who have been baptised into a Christian church, who have now decided to become fully initiated into the Catholic Church. Once they have been suitably prepared, and experienced the Sacrament of Reconciliation and spiritual renewal, candidates can receive the Sacraments of Confirmation and first Holy Communion at any suitable time in the year. This weekend we pray for Chontelle and Emma who are candidates for Initiation for Pentecost.

The faith journey for both Catechumens and Candidates is often begins with Alpha: As RCIA Coordinator I am deeply thankful to the Alpha team and the work they do. Diane Redmayne

Holy Gospel according to Luke 6:27-49

Jesus said to his disciples: 'I say this to you who are listening: Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who treat you badly. To the man who slaps you on one cheek,

present the other cheek too; to the man who takes your cloak from you, do not refuse your tunic. Give to everyone who asks you, and do not ask for your property back from the man who robs you.

Treat others as you would like them to treat you. If you love those who love you, what thanks can you expect? Even sinners love those who love them. And if you do good to those who do good to you, what thanks can you expect?





For even sinners do that much. And if you lend to those from whom you hope to receive, what thanks can you expect? Even sinners lend to sinners to get back the same amount. Instead, love your enemies and do good, and lend without any hope of return. You will have a great reward, and you will be sons of the Most High, for he himself is kind to the ungrateful and the wicked.

'Be compassionate as your Father is compassionate. Do not judge, and you will not be judged yourselves; do not condemn, and you will not be condemned yourselves; grant pardon, and you will be pardoned. Give, and there will be gifts for you: a full measure, pressed down, shaken together, and running over, will be poured into your lap; because the amount you measure out is the amount you will be given back.'

Learning the Language of Heaven

Jesus challenges us to unlearn the language of the world and to learn a language which is counter-cultural, paradoxical, perplexing, such as: 'Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you' etc, etc. Are such attitudes and actions possible?

Our Lord is the best model. Jesus *is* the Word of God in human history. Jesus *is* the language of Heaven spoken in a human life. We have to read the Gospels and then imitate His dialect. Otherwise we might merely mutter to ourselves which would end up being eternally Hellish.

When we become aware of our language malpractice, i.e., sinning, and if we become *really* tongue-tied, i.e., seriously sinning, we can come to the Sacrament of Confession and emerge articulate and conversant with Christ again. We can talk with Our Lord again. We are singing the same tune.

Then at the moment of death we can gracefully pass over to our intended destiny which is not incommunicado, but communicado, holy communicado, holy conversation with God and with every creature. We might pause for a moment and resolve to practise the language of Heaven and to 'walk the talk' every day.
