### Blessed Francisco Palau y Quer, founder of the Carmelite Missionaries

It was in the little island of El Vedrà (Spain) that this remarkable hermit discovered the central point of his mission: to serve and defend the object of his ardent love, the Holy Church, THE MYSTICAL BODY OF CHRIST, which he contemplated mystically under the prototype of Mary.

From this experience his life made him become a hermit, apostle, mystic, prophet, exorcist... These diverse facets harmonized in the soul of this Carmelite friar who, in his excelling love for the Church, became mystically united to her.

In 1860 he founded a mixed Congregation of Third Order of Discalced Carmelites, including both Brothers and Sisters, in the Balearic Islands (Spain). The legacy of this foundation is carried on by two religious congregations of women who serve throughout the world.

The Carmelite Missionaries put up a foundation that will carry on the work bearing the name of Fr. Francisco Palau. That is called FFPFI (FR. FRANCISCO PALAU FOUNDATION INCORPORATED). This foundation has the goal of uplifting the economic, educational, moral and spiritual situation of our brothers and sisters who need our support. It envisions a society of transformed and self-empowered individuals living in communion with love of God and neighbour enjoying their dignity as human beings.

The specific means by which this foundation expresses itself in assisting our needy brothers and sisters are all found in their established objectives, as follows: "FEEDING PROGRAM " EDUCATION SCHOLARSHIP " HELP VICTIMS OF NATURAL CALAMITIES "INCOME GENERATING PROJECT FOR THE POOR " INTEGRAL FORMATION FOR THE POOR " PROMOTE OTHER PROJECTS FOR THE

BENEFITS OF THE POOREST OF THE POOR.

We invite you to become part of this journey of communion with our more challenged brethren by sharing the blessings that you received from God according to your kindness and generosity. We believe that God is never outdone in generosity, and He will continue to call more people who are willing to manifest into the world the generosity of God by through their generous sharing of blessings to our needy brethren.



### Holy Gospel according to Mark 12:38-44

#### This poor widow has put more in than all who contributed.

In his teaching Jesus said, 'Beware of the scribes who like to walk about in long robes, to be greeted obsequiously in the market squares, to take the front seats in the synagogues and the places of honour at banquets; these are the men who swallow the property of widows, while making a show of lengthy prayers. The more severe will be the sentence they receive.'

He sat down opposite the treasury and watched the people putting money into the treasury, and many of the rich put in a great deal. A poor widow came and put in two small coins, the equivalent of a penny. Then he called to his disciples and said to them, 'I tell you solemnly, this poor widow has put more in than all who have contributed to the treasury; for they have all put in money they had over, but she from the little she had has put in everything she possessed, all she had to live on.'

### Gospel Reflection by Diane Bergant

The willingness to give all that one has is the central theme of today's readings. They offer us three models.

Jesus is the ultimate example of heroic generosity. He first offered himself as expiation for our sin. Now, as the eternal high priest, he stands before God as our mediator, pleading on our behalf, bringing salvation to those who eagerly await him.

It is interesting to note that the other two models of selfless giving are widows, individuals who are doubly disadvantaged by the patriarchal societies of which they are members. Their generosity is religiously inspired, and it comes from women who had the least material possessions to give. This kind of giving requires that we reach deep into ourselves and almost strip ourselves of our hold on life, and that we do this for religious reasons. The giving that is pictured in today's readings is nothing less than heroic generosity.

God will not be outdone in generosity. Sometimes we become the beneficiaries of obvious blessing, as was the case in the story of the woman of Zarephath who was granted a year's supply of floor and oil. At other times, we simply continue living life as usual, like the woman in the temple who was unaware of the commendation that Jesus had given her. The truly generous do not look for reward. They carry out their responsibilities and place the rest in God's hands.
